

Sunday School Lesson: Christ Is King When Politics Feel Hard

Source essay: `Christ Is King When Politics Makes You Bitter.md`

Age: 3-6 years old

Length: 25-35 minutes

Main truth: Christ is King even when the world feels angry or confusing.

Memory verse: "The LORD reigneth." - Psalm 93:1, KJV

Teacher's Big Idea

This essay addresses political bitterness with Christ's kingship. For small children, the lesson must avoid partisan details and teach something stable: people may argue, but Jesus is still King, and His people should stay calm, truthful, and loving.

Supplies

- A Bible
- A crown picture
- A peace heart picture
- A globe picture
- Coloring supplies
- A cross picture

Opening Question

Ask: "What should we remember when people around us are upset?"

Let children answer. Then say: "Today we will learn this truth: Christ is King even when the world feels angry or confusing."

Bible Time

Hold up the Bible and say: "God's Word tells us the truth about Jesus and His saving work."

"The LORD reigneth." - Psalm 93:1, KJV

Explain: "Christ is King even when the world feels angry or confusing."

Repeat-after-me phrase:

"Jesus is still King."

Simple Teaching

1. People Can Be Upset

Teacher say: "The world can feel noisy and angry."

Child repeat: "The world feels hard."

2. Jesus Is Still King

Teacher say: "No argument can remove Jesus from His throne."

Child repeat: "Jesus is still King."

3. Jesus Helps Us Be Peaceful

Teacher say: "We can speak truth and love our neighbors."

Child repeat: "Walk in peace."

Object Lesson

Show the globe picture and say: "Sometimes the world feels loud."

Hold up the crown picture and say: "But Jesus is still King."

Show the peace heart picture and say: "Jesus helps His people stay calm and loving."

Movement Activity

- "The world feels hard." Shrug shoulders gently.
- "Jesus is still King." Lift hands like a crown.
- "Walk in peace." Place hands on heart.
- "Love your neighbor." Open arms wide.
- "Trust the Lord." Fold hands in prayer.

Repeat once with the children.

Short Story Illustration

Nora heard grown-ups talking loudly and felt confused about why everyone sounded upset.

Her father reminded her that even when people argue, Jesus is still King.

At church Nora learned that God's people can stay peaceful because Christ rules over the whole world.

Discussion Questions

1. What is the main truth today?

Expected answer: Christ is King even when the world feels angry or confusing.

2. What should we remember?

Expected answer: Jesus is still King.

3. Who helps God's people?

Expected answer: Jesus.

4. Is God's Word true?

Expected answer: Yes.

5. What should we do?

Expected answer: Trust and obey the Lord.

Craft or Table Activity

Draw a crown above a heart and write: "Jesus is still King."

Closing Prayer

Our Father in heaven, thank You for Your true Word and for the Lord Jesus Christ. Help us believe Your promises, love what is true, and walk in faith and obedience. In Jesus' name, Amen.
